TRANCHE SUBMISSION DELAYS

Introduction

1. Pursuant to decision 47/50(d),² the Secretariat has prepared the present document. It presents actions taken in response to decisions on tranche submission delays adopted at the 93rd meeting; an analysis of each of the tranches that were due but were not submitted to the 94th meeting and the tranches that were submitted but subsequently withdrawn during the project review process. It also provides an overview of the reasons for the delays and the impact on compliance with the countries' obligations under the Montreal Protocol, and the Secretariat's recommendation.

I. Follow-up to decisions taken on tranche submission delays at the 93rd meeting

- 2. At the 93^{rd} meeting, 15^3 of the 31 countries that had been scheduled to submit tranche requests, had not done so on time, representing a non-submission rate of 48 per cent. Subsequently, the Executive Committee *inter alia* requested the Secretariat to send letters to the relevant Governments regarding the decisions on tranche submission delays contained in annex IX to the report of the 93^{rd} meeting (decision 93/27(b)).
- 3. Pursuant to decision 93/27(b), the Secretariat sent letters to the Governments of 17 Article 5 countries⁴ to urge the submission of the next tranche of their HCFC phase-out management plans (HPMPs). As a result, the Governments of Bosnia and Herzegovina,⁵ China,⁶ Egypt,⁷ the Islamic

Republic of Iran,⁸ the Lao People's Democratic Republic,⁹ Sri Lanka,¹⁰ and Timor-Leste,¹¹ submitted respective tranches of their HPMPs to the 94th meeting.

4. However, the Governments of Afghanistan, ¹² Algeria, Botswana, Dominica, Iraq, Kenya, Kuwait, Mauritius, Nepal, and Senegal did not submit their tranche requests.

II. Analysis of tranches not submitted to the 94th meeting

5. Twenty-eight activities associated with tranches of HPMPs for 17 countries including those referred to in paragraph 4, at a total value of US \$10,120,181 (including agency support costs), due for submission to the 94th meeting were not submitted, as shown in annex I to the present document.¹³

III. Reasons for delays and impact on compliance

- 6. The reasons for delays in the submission of tranches of HPMPs include: disbursement below the 20 per cent threshold of approved funds for the previous tranche (15); Government decisions, and/or endorsements, and/or changes in the national ozone unit, and/or structural change (12); sufficient funds from previous tranche approved (6); internal or external difficulties (2); submission of progress and financial reports (2); lack of verification report (2); enterprise delays (1); lead or cooperating agency not ready for submission (1); signing of agreement or project document (1); technical issues (1); slow implementation (1); procurement delays (1); and investment component (1). For the delays in the submissions, more than one reason may apply.
- 7. As reported by the relevant implementing agencies, delays in the submission of tranches that were past due would have no impact on compliance with the countries' obligations under the Montreal Protocol. All outstanding tranches are expected to be submitted to the 95th meeting, except for Algeria, who will not request the remaining tranches of stage I of its HPMP, based on the letter received from the Government on 15 April 2024.

IV. Recommendation

- 8. The Executive Committee may wish:
 - (a) To note:
 - (i) The report on tranche submission delays contained in document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/94/13:
 - (ii) The information on tranche submission delays under HCFC phase-out management plans (HPMPs) submitted by the Governments of France and Germany and UNDP, UNEP and UNIDO;
 - (iii) That 32 out of 60 activities (18 out of 35 countries) related to tranches of HPMPs due for submission at the 94th meeting had been submitted on time;

- (iv) That relevant bilateral and implementing agencies had indicated that the late submission of the tranches of HPMPs due for submission at the first meeting of 2024 would have no impact on countries' compliance with the Montreal Protocol, and that there was no indication that any of the countries concerned were in non-compliance with the Montreal Protocol control measures; and
- (b) To request the Secretariat to send letters to the relevant Governments regarding the decisions on tranche submission delays contained in annex I to the present report.
