WRITTEN VIEWS SUBMITTED BY GHANA PURSUANT TO DECISION 93/103

Policies and regulations

1. National cool action plan should be expanded to cold chain and help with food security and post-harvest food loss. Respective member nations should transmit national cool action plan to the national governing council or federal executive council for national policy adoption, implementation, and enforcement.

Cooling and phase-down

2. In addition to education and capacity development, substantial provision of alternative refrigerants by indigenous manufacturer(s) to be encouraged, promoted and funded.

Energy efficiency

3. Promote net-zero designs and decarbonization by encouraging consulting engineers to adopt climate mitigation concepts. Subscribe to an organization like ASHRAE for intellectual and research-based resources and effective collaboration.

Sector approaches

4. Support equipment manufacturers and mobilize awareness campaign to end users.

Refrigerant reclamation

5. Fund refrigerant reclamation and incineration research and technologies.

Equipment end-of-life management

6. The current management of refrigeration equipment need to be wholistically discussed to engage all relevant stakeholders, technical persons capacitated, and the process supported financially to include collection, dismantling and management of the final waste.

New technologies

7. New refrigeration technologies that have been less dominant such as CO₂ refrigeration technologies could be increased through piloting and upscaled.

8. With mobile air-conditioning, new technologies that use low GWP refrigerants could be supported and promoted.
