DRAFT BUSINESS PLAN FOR THE YEAR 2002 OF UNIDO

COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE FUND SECRETARIAT

- 1. The total value of investment projects currently proposed to be submitted by UNIDO in 2002 is US \$36.5 million including 15 per cent over-programming including US \$2 million for project preparation. This level of funding is expected to result in the phase-out of 3,015 ODP tonnes.
- 2. The largest amount of funding is targeted for the refrigeration sector (US \$12.5 million) followed by the fumigant sector (US \$7 million).
- 3. UNIDO is expected to submit requests for US \$2.5 million for non-investment activities for 16 non-investment projects including one institutional strengthening project at a cost of US \$200,000, ten refrigerant management plan projects at a cost of US\$2 million, one technical assistance project at a cost of US \$100,000 and four training projects costing in total US \$150,000.
- 4. UNIDO's contingency list, Annex 5, contains projects valued at US \$11.9 million in the following ten countries: Algeria, China, Indonesia, Korea DPR, Morocco, Nigeria, Pakistan, Sudan, Venezuela and Zimbabwe. These projects would replace projects that UNIDO identified as having policy issues including: extruded foam projects in Brazil and Syria; fumigation projects in the Dominican Republic and Honduras; an aluminium sector project in Egypt; an enduser project in Kenya; commercial refrigeration projects in Mexico and Venezuela; a rigid foam project in Turkey; a foam umbrella project in Venezuela; and a halon banking project in Vietnam.

Activities and Assistance for Compliance

- 5. UNIDO is planning 12 activities (87 ODP tonnes) in countries that may not be in compliance with the CFC freeze or with incomplete data; 29 activities (799 ODP tonnes) in countries that may achieve the freeze but not the 50 per cent reduction; and 46 activities (1,202 ODP tonnes) to maintain momentum. US \$8.8 million is allocated for those at risk for the first two controls and over US \$12.4 million for those that appear to be able to achieve them. Also, US \$735,000 is allocated for countries that may be at risk due to incomplete data reporting.
- 6. For halon, UNIDO has included in its 2002 draft business plan one activity (76 ODP tonnes) for a country that might not achieve the 2002 freeze, one activity (with no phase-out) for a country that may not achieve the 50 per cent reduction, and one activity (32 ODP tonnes) for a country to maintain momentum. Of the 15 methyl bromide activities in the business plan, 10 (305 ODP tonnes) are included for countries at risk to meet the methyl bromide freeze and the 20 per cent reduction in 2005 or with incomplete data, and 5 activities (113 ODP tonnes) for countries to maintain momentum. UNIDO has four activities (250 ODP tonnes) in the CTC sector in countries for which data was incomplete to assess potential compliance. UNIDO has included three TCA activities (71 ODP tonnes) in its business plan including 2 activities (34 ODP tonnes) for countries at risk of non-compliance with the freeze and the 30 per cent reduction, and one activity (37 ODP tonnes) for a country with incomplete data. In addition,

UNIDO has also included one activity in the production sector for Korea DPR and two activities for phasing out CTC/TCA in the solvent sector.

Project Preparation

7. Project preparation in 2002 is planned to be submitted for 15 activities in countries that might need additional actions to achieve the CFC controls through 2005 (including those with no data) out of a total of 30 activities; two activities in countries at risk to achieve the methyl bromide freeze (including one with no data) out of the total of 3 activities; and one activity in a country at risk to achieve the TCA freeze and 30 per cent reduction. It is also submitting 4 activities for phasing out CTC and TCA and one activity in the CFC production sector and 2 activities in the multiple sector.

COMMENTS

Projects under implementation critical to compliance

- 8. In reviewing UNIDO's portfolio, the Secretariat noted that the following countries appear not to be in compliance with the CFC freeze where UNIDO is currently implementing projects: Cameroon, Libya, Nigeria, Oman and Yemen. Oman's project will not have a direct impact on phase out. UNIDO provided updated information on the status of these projects.
- 9. Cameroon was one of the five Article 5 countries that the Thirteenth Meeting of the Parties decided was in non-compliance and asked for an action plan. UNIDO indicated that all equipment was installed and the expected completion is December 2001 for the two LCD projects in Cameroon.
- 10. UNIDO has 10 refrigeration projects under implementation in Nigeria; 7 of which are planned to be completed in 2001. UNIDO indicated that of the seven projects, four would be completed in 2001 and three, in the middle of 2002.
- 11. Although projects are planned to be completed after 2002, UNIDO indicated that the projects in Libya and Yemen are proceeding according to the project milestones.

Performance indicators

12. Table 1 presents a comparison between UNIDO's approved 2001 business plan performance indicators for investment projects and those proposed for 2002.

- 13. Based on planned completion dates in UNIDO's progress report submitted to the 34th Meeting, UNIDO should achieve a phase out of 4,189 ODP tonnes in 2002 as opposed to its target of 2,500 ODP tonnes. UNIDO indicated that since its progress report, it had received feedback from the field that indicated additional problems unforeseen previously.
- 14. UNIDO has set a target for cost-effectiveness of US \$9.12/kg. compared to its 2001 target of US \$7.76/kg. UNIDO explained that this was due to a larger number of Methyl Bromide projects with costly technology (steam pasteurisation), a higher number of small projects in the refrigeration sector, 12 projects in the solvent and process agent sector, and few projects in the more cost-effective sectors such as the aerosol sector. The Secretariat reviewed UNIDO's submission in this regard. The following table presents a comparison between the 2001 and 2002 business plans:

- 15. Through 2000, UNIDO disbursed funds for projects, on average, 9 months after project approval. Its target for 2002 is 12 months. UNIDO indicated that the increase was due to the Executive Committee's decision on refrigeration management plans that does not allow disbursement until policy measures are in place.
- 16. UNIDO set a target of 7,058 ODP tonnes for net emissions due to delays. The Secretariat calculated an estimate of 6,563 for this indicator based on information in UNIDO's progress report that was submitted to the 34th Meeting. UNIDO indicated that the additional delays since the progress report resulted in higher target for projected net emissions due to delays.
- 17. Table 2 presents a comparison between UNIDO's approved 2001 business plan performance indicators for non-investment projects and those proposed for 2002.

18. For the year 2002, UNIDO expects that it will take two months longer until first disbursement. Through 2000, UNIDO achieved first disbursement for non-investment projects 8 months after approval.

- 19. UNIDO did not provide targets for the two non-weighted, non-investment project performance indicators. The Executive Committee will be considering modifications to these targets in its consideration of document UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/16, the Report on Performance Indicators and Proposal on Modifications.
- 20. It should be noted however, that UNIDO's progress report indicated that it planned to phase out 119 ODP tonnes from non-investment projects in 2002.

Bilateral activities

21. UNIDO attached to its business plan a list of bilateral activities approved by the Executive Committee that it is implementing for bilateral agencies. UNIDO is implementing 4 projects valued at US \$5.8 million that will lead to the phase out of 366 ODP tonnes. UNIDO has activities under implementation for the following bilateral agencies: France, Italy, and Japan.

Forward commitments

22. UNIDO's forward commitments relate to multi-year methyl bromide investment projects and China's multi-year tobacco sector project. After 2002, UNIDO will have US \$20 million in forward commitments of which US \$2 million is for the tobacco sector project.

Comments on specific projects

- 23. UNIDO has included US \$60,000 for the implementation of customs training in Egypt. Germany has received funds for customs training for Egypt at the 29th Meeting as part of the project "modification of legal provisions and information system" per the project description. UNIDO indicated that it was informed by GTZ and Egypt that customs training was not part of the funded project and Egypt requested UNIDO to provide assistance in customs training.
- 24. UNIDO also allocated US \$1 million for an end user project in Kenya. Kenya's 1999 CFC consumption was 241.1 ODP tonnes against which 8.5 ODP tonnes were approved but unimplemented. UNIDO indicated that the level of funding allocated was based on the request of the Government. Kenya was included in the RMP prepared by Germany for the 14 countries in the East African region. Germany has included an RMP supplement for these countries in its business plan as indicated in UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/6.
- 25. UNIDO also included US \$30,000 for the preparation of a halon bank for Oman. Germany also plans to submit a similar project. This overlap was raised with Germany and UNIDO. Oman was originally included in the West Asia region halon banking proposal submitted by Germany but was removed pending a decision on Oman's eligibility to receive support from the Fund. UNIDO indicated that the project was included in its business plan at the request of the Government.

- 26. The business plan letter indicates that Kenya has phased out flexible and rigid foams, but it was seeking funds for the phase out of 25 tonnes of polyurethane foam at the Twiga Company. The Twiga Company has received funds for flexible and rigid foam phase out. Kenya's country programme indicated that it had phased out foam. UNIDO indicated that the project was included in its business plan based on the request from the Government.
- 27. Macedonia is requesting a 50 per cent supplement to address 30 of the remaining 50 tonnes of its consumption. The Secretariat requested UNIDO to indicate how Macedonia would address its remaining consumption. UNIDO indicated that the RMP supplement would assist Macedonia to completely phase out the servicing sector and the remaining consumption would be gradually phased-out by replacement of old CFC containing equipment without direct assistance of the Fund.

Policy issues

- 28. UNIDO provided the following information on projects that it listed with policy issues. Although its business plans contains 11 projects with issues, UNIDO provided information about the issues associated with 6 projects. Projects in Brazil and Mexico were included with policy issues because there is a data discrepancy that needs to be resolved to determine if the projects included in UNIDO's business plan could be submitted in 2002.
- 29. Methyl bromide projects were listed with policy issues for the Dominican Republic and Honduras. UN headquarters in New York has not officially recorded their ratifications of the Copenhagen Amendments, although both countries have indicated that their Governments have ratified.
- 30. An issue may arise for the project for "Other CFC-12" in Egypt because the project is a new sector in the aluminium industry, the first such project submitted to the Executive Committee.

Business Plan Letters

31. UNIDO provided letters or explanations for all of the projects included therein. For those projects that were not included in the letters, UNIDO explained that the projects that it included in its draft 2002 business plan were: based on the country programme where the projects identified for UNIDO implementation, developed from project preparation which had already been approved, or annual funding requests for multi-year funding projects that had already been approved in principle by the Executive Committee.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Monitoring, Evaluation and Finance Sub-Committee may wish to consider:

1. Noting UNIDO's draft business plan contained in UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/9.

- 2. Requesting UNIDO to modify its investment project performance indicator targets for ODP phase out in 2002, cost-effectiveness, and speed of first disbursement; its non-investment performance indicator targets for speed of first disbursement; and provide targets for the non-weighted, non-investment project performance indicators taking into account the Sub-Committee's consideration of the Report on the Performance Indicators and Proposal on Modifications (UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/16).
- 3. Requesting UNIDO to take into account comments provided in UNEP/OzL.Pro/ExCom/35/9 concerning planned activities in Egypt, Kenya, and Oman in the finalisation of its 2002 business plan.
- 4. Requesting UNIDO to provide letters from countries for all activities that it includes in its final business plan for 2002.

UNIDO DRAFT BUSINESS PLAN 2002

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The UNIDO 2002 draft business plan has been prepared based on the requests received so far by Article 5 countries and taking into account the priorities established by the Executive Committee as well as decisions taken by this same body. It also reflects the discussions held recently in Montreal, during the inter-agency coordination meeting, whereby an analysis of the compliance situation (freeze and reduction targets) provided valuable information on certain Article 5 countries in dire need of assistance.

In other words, this draft business plan after careful review of all the data available on Article 5 countries has the aim to reflect this need for compliance, as well as the need to keep the momentum in certain countries well advanced in their respective phase out programmes.

In addition to that, letters have been sent to countries still showing data inconsistencies in order to obtain clarification and in some cases updated information on their consumption on a sectoral basis. As a result few countries have been added in this draft business plan.

The analysis of the investment project portfolio proposed in this Business Plan shows (see Annex A) that in average 73 % of the projects in various sectors will be carried out in countries who are facing difficulties in reaching either their 1999 freeze or/and their 2005 reduction target.

The number of investment projects to be prepared in 2002 and submitted for consideration by the Executive Committee will be 100 for an estimated budget of US\$36,543,000 (including support cost and 15 per cent overprogramming) and an ODP phase out of 3,014 tonnes. Specifically this programme will include 55 projects in the refrigeration sector, 12 in the foam sector, 11 in the methyl bromide sector including second tranches for 4 multi-year projects already approved, 7 in the solvent sector, 4 in the process agents sector, 4 in the aerosol sector, 3 in the halon sector, 1 in the production sector, 2 classified as other sector, and finally one in the end-users sector.

In addition, three (3) awareness workshops in the methyl bromide sector are planned in order to prevent the reintroduction of methyl bromide, as well as refrigerant management plans (RMPs) activities in nine (9) countries (namely training of trainers, training of customs officers) and the renewal of the institutional strengthening activity for Yugoslavia.

The budget estimated for these non-investment projects is US\$2,825,000 (including support costs).

In order to eventually replace projects with policy issues, UNIDO will prepare 22 projects for a value of approximately US\$11,865,000 (including support costs and 15 per cent overprogramming) and an ODP phase out of 1,388 tonnes.

BUSINESS PLAN NARRATIVE

A. Multilateral Fund targets

1. Introduction

In 2002, 100 investment projects will be prepared for a value of US\$36,543,000 (including support costs and 15 per cent over-programming), phasing out 3,014 ODP tonnes.

In addition, 22 projects will be prepared and be in reserve for submission for a value of US\$11,865,000 (including support costs and 15 per cent overprogramming) and an ODP of 1,388 tonnes.

UNIDO will also include in its business plan funding for the second tranches for multi-year methyl bromide projects in Lebanon, Morocco, Syria and Turkey while keeping on using the partial funding concept for new projects in the Dominican Republic, Egypt, Guatemala and Honduras.

UNIDO will also start its first project in the production sector in DPR Korea by requesting a first tranche.

Finally it is worth to note that UNIDO has received requests from Croatia, India, Iran and Romania to initiate the preparation of phase out projects in the metered dose inhalers (MDI) sector.

3. Geographical distribution

In 2002, UNIDO will again cover all the regions (Latin America and the Caribbean, Africa, Asia and Pacific, Europe) with planned activities in various sectors for thirty-six (36) countries. (Including non-investment activities, and contingency list)

4. Programme expansion

a. Background

At an inter-agency coordination meeting held in Montreal in September this year, it was agreed that the draft business plan should be prepared based on requests received by ozone offices in Article 5 countries, and the analysis presented by the Multilateral Fund Secretariat on status of compliance of the respective countries.

This analysis tried to identify a group of countries in need of immediate assistance in order to comply with the various phase out schedules (CFCs, Halons, CTC, Methyl Bromide, etc.), as well as countries that are well advanced in their respective phase out programmes.

In that respect, requests have been jointly reviewed by the Agencies and the Multilateral Fund Secretariat and whenever it was felt that additional activities could be included, Agencies agreed to alert Ozone Officers in order to have a better coverage of the effective needs.

In addition to that, countries still showing data inconsistencies in their reporting to both the Ozone Secretariat in Nairobi and the Multilateral Fund Secretariat, would receive letters seeking clarification before inclusion of activities in the business planning process.

Therefore, this draft business plan was prepared taking into account these elements, and bearing in mind the usefulness of including activities for countries in compliance in order to keep the momentum.

It is also worth to note that, in consultation with the Multilateral Fund Secretariat, it was agreed that funds for project preparation in a new sector, i.e. the MDI sector, could be requested.

b. Project preparation of investment projects

Annexes II, III and IV indicate that 100 projects in ten (10) sectors, estimated at a value of US\$36,543,000 (including 15% overprogramming, including support costs) for an ODP of 3,014 tonnes, are foreseen for submission in 2002. In addition, 22 projects for a value of US\$11,865,000 and an ODP of 1,388 tonnes will be kept in reserve in order to replace projects with policy issues.

This draft business plan shows the following main points:

- The refrigeration sector is still a predominant sector but including refrigerant management plans.
- A significant decrease in the foam and aerosol sectors.
- A progressive increase in the methyl bromide sector.
- Two emerging new sectors such as the MDI sector with four requests for a programme development, and end-users with one request.
- The preparation of the first UNIDO project in the production sector.

This draft business plan has the objective to assist Article 5 countries in meeting their obligations under the Montreal Protocol, by suggesting phase out projects as well as technical assistance activities. It is expected that tonnages to be eliminated will at least coincide with the forthcoming targets of 2005 for CFCs, Halons, CTC and Methyl Bromide while helping a group of countries to maintain the momentum in their phase out efforts.

Africa

In Africa, 19 projects in 9 countries, with a value of US\$5,440,000 and an ODP of 524.5 tonnes will be submitted in 2002.

An amount of US\$130,000 is requested for the development of these activities.

Asia

In Asia, 53 projects in 11 countries, with a value of US\$16,850,000 and an ODP of 1,434 tonnes will be submitted in 2002.

An amount of US\$315,000 is requested for the development of these activities.

Europe

In Europe, 11 projects in 7 countries, with a value of US\$3,014,000 and an ODP of 364 tonnes will be submitted in 2002.

An amount of US\$165,000 is requested for the development of these activities.

Latin America and the Caribbean

In Latin America and the Caribbean, 17 projects in 7 countries, with a value of US\$7,035,000 and an ODP of 692 tonnes.

An amount of US\$485,000 is requested for the development of these activities.

c. Non-investment projects

In 2002, UNIDO is planning the organization of three awareness workshops in order to prevent the use or reintroduction of methyl bromide in Albania, Mali and Panama, the renewal of one institutional strengthening project in Yugoslavia, the preparation of a phase-out strategy in the methyl bromide sector in China, and training activities in the context of a refrigerant management plan in Algeria, Argentina, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Cameroon, Egypt, Iran, Mexico, Pakistan, Tunisia and Yugoslavia.

The total amount requested for these activities is estimated to US\$2,715,000.

B. Policy issues

In light of new decisions of the Executive Committee highlighting additional requirements for Agencies as well as discussions on the strategic planning, it may be

worthwhile to review the weighted performance indicators in order to address these new developments.

Projects that may face policy issues are as follows:


- Brazil (Commercial refrigeration): Data inconsistencies are under clarification with the Government;
